

Statement from the Moncur Family

On February 6, 2025, our beloved husband, father, son, brother, and friend, JaDee Brent Moncur, was tragically taken from us in the crash of Bering Air Flight 445. JaDee was a devoted husband to Stacey, a proud father to Carter, Ethan, and Olivia, and an extraordinary man who lived with joy, generosity, service, and an unending love for family, community, and the Alaska wilderness.

JaDee's loss has left a profound void in our hearts and in the lives of countless friends and family who were fortunate to know him. His commitment to service, whether through church, scouting, or everyday acts of love and support, defined who he was. He cherished moments spent outdoors, from fishing and hunting to flying and exploring the mountains and rivers of Alaska, always ensuring that others were safe and cared for.

JaDee lived his life doing what he loved. Serving, flying, riding, playing, loving, and working hard. Our world is much smaller without him in it. We love him and are so grateful we have eternity to spend with him. He is missed. He is loved.

In the wake of this tragedy, we have taken legal action to seek answers and accountability regarding the circumstances of the crash. With the support of our attorneys, Aviation Law Group, a wrongful-death lawsuit has been filed to ensure a thorough investigation of the accident and to pursue justice for our family and the other families who lost loved ones. We hope that through this process, we can contribute to greater aviation safety so that others do not have to endure what we have.

Our family deeply appreciates the outpouring of love, prayers, and support from near and far that we have received over the past year. The strength shown by our community, friends, and strangers alike has been a source of comfort during the hardest of days. As we continue to grieve, we also hold onto the memories of JaDee's laughter, his generous heart, and the ways he made every life he touched brighter.

We ask that you respect our family's privacy at this time as we focus on healing and honoring JaDee's legacy.
